5-30-11 superintendent-undercover sting

MILWAUKEE (AP) — The lawyer for a former school superintendent in New Holstein says his client's life has been "damaged" by his conviction of using a computer to facilitate a sex crime. Attorney Richard Hart says 59-year-old Christopher Nelson got involved in something he never should have gotten involved in. He said Saturday that Nelson is working to fix things with his family and is seeking psychological treatment. Nelson pleaded guilty to the charge Friday. Nelson was the superintendent of New Holstein schools. He was arrested in January in an online sex sting after arranging for a rendezvous with a 15-year-old boy who was actually a Milwaukee police officer. He faces a maximum prison sentence of 25 years when he is sentenced June 30.

5-30-11 former tci guard gets 18 years in prison

A former Taycheeda women's prison guard has been sentenced to 18 years in prison for sexually assaulting inmates. Fond du lac Judge, Gary Sharpe, sentenced 36 year old Jimmie Brown to 18 years behind bars and 18 years extended supervision. District Attorney, Dan Kaminsky, had recommended 28 years in prison and Brown's attorney recommended eight years. In February Brown was convicted on 16 of 18 counts of sexual assault by a corrections officer. Investigators say Brown had sexual contact with seven different inmates at TCI. One inmate claimed a forcible rape.

5-30-11 depicts disappearance suspect

MILWAUKEE (AP) — A convicted kidnapper is now claiming he abducted 39 women, including one from Wisconsin who vanished nearly 20 years ago. Larry DeWayne Hall is currently serving a life sentence in a North Carolina prison for kidnapping a teenage girl from Illinois, whose body was found in Indiana. Hall recently told Wisconsin authorities that he killed Laurie Depies in 1992.

5-30-11 berlin woman charged with child sex assault

GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — A Berlin woman accused of sexually assaulting a teenage boy could face bail-jumping charges. The Brown County sheriff's department says Rae Mackin was arrested Wednesday after a tip claimed she was preparing to flee the state. Mackin allegedly had consensual sex with the 13-year-old as another person goaded them.

5-30-11 berlin man charged in shooting incident

A preliminary hearing is scheduled for next month for a Berlin man accused of firing gunshots outside his residence. Forty two year old Carl Meeks is charged with second degree recklessly endangering safety

5-30-11 collective bargaining law

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — State attorneys have asked the Wisconsin Supreme Court to immediately vacate a Madison judge's ruling striking down Governor Scott Walker's contentious collective bargaining law. Judge Maryann Sumi invalidated the law yesterday. She ruled Republican lawmakers violated the state's open meetings law during the run-up to passage in March.

5-30-11 recall elections

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — Wisconsin state election officials have delayed a final decision on three recall petitions targeting Democratic senators, putting the July 12th date of the recall elections in doubt. A Government Accountability Board spokesman said today the board's staff needs more time to review factual and legal challenges to the petitions targeting the senators.

5-30-11 uw madison spin-off proposal dead

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — Governor Scott Walker's proposal to break off the Madison campus from the rest of the University of Wisconsin System is dead. UW-Madison lobbyist Don Nelson said today talks continue with state lawmakers over what new flexibilities the Madison campus can be given to control its budget and make other decisions.

5-30-11 washington county drowning

RICHFIELD, Wis. (AP) — A 27-year-old Milwaukee man is dead after a gust of wind overturned a small rowing boat in Lake Fries in Washington County. The county sheriff's office received the report about 6:45 p.m. yesterday that a 12-foot boat tipped over about 150 feet from shore in Richfield.

5-30-11 city of fdl receives community development block grant for low income housing

The city of Fond du Lac is receiving more than a half million dollars in Community Development Block Grant funding to provide affordable housing for low income persons. The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development Friday announced the final fiscal year 2011 block grant allocations to approximately 1,200 state and local governments. HUD press release says the CDBG overall funding was reduced by more than \$600 million or approximately 16.5 percent compared to last year.

Sunny 97.7 WFDL news has won more awards this year for excellence in broadcast journalism than any other radio station in the state. The awards dinner was held this month at Lambeau Field in Green Bay. For the fourth year in a row Stensland took home first place for **Best Newscast**. 5-30-11 fdl county sheriff's department law of the month

Does tailgating force the driver in front of you to speed up or get out of your way? No, tailgating typically won't get you where you're going any sooner, but it will increase your risk of a crash. Drivers who tailgate cause countless crashes—from fender benders to fatal collisions—that could be avoided if they would just leave sufficient space between their vehicle and the one ahead of them. It doesn't matter if you're driving on a busy highway or a city street, if the vehicle in front of you stops unexpectedly, you're likely to crash unless you leave enough room to stop completely. You should also slowdown to leave sufficient space when approaching stop lights, intersections, and when changing lanes. To avoid rear-end crashes, you should anticipate potentially hazardous situations, like traffic slowdowns in work zones, that could cause the driver in front of you to stop suddenly. According to state law, drivers "shall not follow another vehicle more closely than is reasonable and prudent" based on the speed of the vehicle, road conditions, and traffic. A violation of the law costs \$200.50 along with three demerit points. In addition, car insurance premiums often will skyrocket for drivers who hit another vehicle

while following too closely. During the upcoming summer travel season when traffic increases, it's extremely important to always wear a safety belt just in case you're rear ended by a tailgater. Taking a few seconds to ensure that you and your passengers are buckled up may be the best decision you'll ever make.
