10-1-11 storm closes state parks

MILWAUKEE (AP) —All state parks in a popular vacation spot in Wisconsin are closed because strong winds have toppled trees and power lines. Yesterday's high winds knocked out power to residents throughout the state, but particularly hard hit was Door County. Schools in the Southern Door, Gibraltar and Sevastopol districts were closed because of power outages Friday.

10-1-11 wind damage

Significant damage to boats on the east shore of Lake Winnebago in Fond du Lac County. Fond du Lac County Sheriff's Captain, Dean Will says strong winds in excess of 50 mph early Friday morning damaged boats and jet skis in the Linden Beach and Sylvan Bay areas. Will says describes the damage as "significant."

10-1-11 sex offender being released into fdl community

Darin S. Klumpyan

Birthdate: December 17, 1966

Darin S. Klumpyan will be released from prison on October 2, 2011 after serving 7 years for 2nd Degree Sexual Assault of a Child and three counts of Lewd and Lascivious Behavior. Klumpyan was convicted of sexually assaulting a 15-year-old female acquaintance through coercion. In addition, he was convicted for exposing himself to both adult and juvenile victims. Klumpyan also has convictions for looking into adult females windows at night.

Special conditions of Darin S. Klumpyan's supervised release:

- 1) No contact with victim, no unsupervised contact with minors, no presence in taverns, bars, or liquor stores, and no use of alcohol or illegal drugs.
- 2) Comply with all rules of high risk sex offender supervision and cooperate with GPS monitoring.
- 3) Face-to-face contact with law enforcement as required, lifetime registration with Wisconsin Sex Offender Registration Program.

Darin S. Klumpyan will be living at 457 Thomas Street in the City of Fond du Lac when he is initially released from incarceration on October 2, 2011.

10-1-11 ripon man bound over for trial in attempted murder for hire case

ARipon man accused of attempting to hire a hit man to kill a former business associate and to injure another former business partner has been bound over for trial. Probable cause was found at a preliminary hearing Friday for Lee Stellmacher. The 60 year old Stellmacher is being held in the Fond du lac County Jail without bail on charges of conspiracy to commit first degree homicide and conspiracy to commit battery. Investigators say Stellmacher tried to hire members of a motorcycle gang to kill a man in Indiana and tried to hire an undercover officer posing as a hit man to injure another man in Wisconsin. The prosecution says a recorded conversation shows Stellmacher clearly wanted the man killed.

10-1-11 dodge county homicide prosecution barred by supreme court ruling

Anow invalid state law prohibits the prosecution of a man involved in a decade old fatal traffic accident. Nicholas Gross of Burnett was convicted of homicide by intoxicated use of a motor vehicle in the August 2001 crash that claimed the life of Suzanne Thiel and injured three others including her daughter Danielle Thiel. Gross was sentenced to ten years in prison and ten years extended supervision. Thiel died earlier this spring from injuries suffered ten years earlier. In 2003 the state supreme court overturned the Year and a Day rule that prevented prosecutions if a person died more than a year after sustaining injuries. However the court also held their ruling only applied to injuries sustained after 2003. Dodge County District Attorney, Kurt Klomberg, says since Thiel was injured in 2001, Gross cannot be prosecuted.

10-1-11 man arrested following short standoff with fdl police

Bail has been set at \$15,000 cash for a Beaver Dam man who threatened to shoot Fond du lac police officers responding to a domestic disturbance. Twenty two year old, Nicholas Clark, is charged with battery, resisting, and domestic abuse related false imprisonment and strangulation. According to a criminal complaint Clark told officers over the phone that a woman inside the home was lucky not to be shot and that he would shoot police if they came into the home. Officers surrounded the house at 56 Doty Street and Clark was arrested when he tried to escape out a back door. A preliminary hearing is scheduled for October 6th.

10-1-11 extreme sports weekend

The Dodge County Sheriff's Department says deputies will be out in force concerned about drinking and driving during this extreme sports weekend. Sheriff Todd Nehls says along with the Packers, Badgers and Brewers many communities are hosting homecoming games...giving sports fans many opportunities for celebration. Nehls says he wants people to have a great time cheering on their team, but also want everyone to get home safely. Nehls says unfortunately history has shown these events are often followed by an increase in drunken driving, injury accidents, family disputes and domestic violence.

10-1-11 cataloupe linked to outbreak sold in wisconsin

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — Officials confirm that cantaloupes linked to a multi-state outbreak of listeria infection were sold in Wisconsin Aldi stores. The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection said Friday that the whole melons from Jensen Farms in Colorado, sold under the brand name Rocky Ford, were shipped to Aldi stores in Wisconsin between Aug. 16 and Sept. 13. Once notified of the Jensen Farms recall, Aldi stores promptly removed the melons from their sales floor Sept. 13 and issued a nationwide recall. However, officials say some melons may remain in customers' homes. The department is still determining whether other Wisconsin retail stores also received the cantaloupes. Two cases of listeriosis among Wisconsin residents have been linked to the outbreak, but they have not been linked to cantaloupe bought at Aldi.

10-1-11 governor's chief of staff stepping down

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — Governor Scott Walker's chief of staff is stepping down. Keith Gilkes says he's resigning as of October 8th to return to his business as a political consultant. He says he may get involved again if Democrats try to recall Walker. Gilkes says his resignation is unrelated to an ongoing secret investigation that stemmed from questions of whether Walker aides took part in political activity on taxpayer time.

10-1-11 fdl county sheriff's department investigating sexual assault on hiking trail



The Fond du Lac County Sheriff's Department has released a composite sketch of a suspect in a reported sexual assault on a town of Fond du Lac hiking trail. Sheriff's Chief Deputy Mark Strand tells WFDL news a woman reported she was sexually assaulted at about 3:15pm Tuesday on the Wild Goose State Trail. The woman described the suspect as a white male with darker skin, a beard, between 40 and 50 years old, wearing jeans and a black shirt. The woman also said the man smelled like cigarettes. 10-1-11 highway t closure

County Highway T from Nelson Rd to Townline Rd will be closed starting October 5, 2011 to reconstruct the bridge over a branch of the West Branch Fond du Lac River in the Town of Lamartine. Construction to replace the load posted and structurally deficient bridge is expected to be completed by mid November, weather permitting. The highway will be closed to all traffic and a detour will be posted via County Highway T (Esterbrook Road), State Highway 23, and County Highway Y.

10-1-11 pioneer road closure

County Highway W (Pioneer Rd) from Park Avenue to Martin Avenue will be closed starting October 10, 2011 for storm sewer construction that is part of the Galloway detention pond being constructed by the City of Fond du Lac. The highway closure is expected to last five days. The highway will be closed to all traffic and a detour will be posted via Park Avenue, Ninth Street, and Martin Avenue.

10-1-11 division street closure

On Monday morning, September 19, the Division Street Bridge at Deneveu Creek will be closed to all vehicular traffic for about three weeks while the concrete bridge deck is resurfaced. At least one sidewalk crossing the bridge will remain open to pedestrians except for about one day while the concrete deck is being placed. The bridge location is east of St Agnes Hospital between Reid Terrace and Oaklawn Avenue. St Agnes Hospital will not be accessible from the east on Division Street. The Hospital is accessible from National Avenue on Second Street and from Park Avenue along Division Street from the west. Bus service on Division Street will be moved to Merrill Avenue from Oaklawn Avenue to the east.

10-1-11 west pioneer road reconstruction update

CTH W; West Pioneer Road Reconstruction

Schedule: July 2011 to November 2011

Length: 0.213 miles

Cost: \$1,848,192.39

Location: Morris Street to Main Street

Description: The project involves the reconstruction of CTH W (Pioneer Road) between Morris Street and Main Street, the reconstruction of the Pioneer Road bridge over the East Branch of the Fond du Lac River and the construction of the Wild Goose Prairie Trail within the project limits.

September 29 to September 30: Bridge crew will begin forming up the deck for the new structure. Grading crew will continue grading the roadway on the east side of the bridge from the FDL River to the east project limits and will begin grading on the west side of the project.

Traffic impacts: CTH W (Pioneer Road) will be closed to through traffic for the duration of the project. Local traffic will have access during the project except when construction is taking place in immediately in the vicinity of their residence or business. The contractor will coordinate with residents and businesses prior to any closures.

Detour Route: Fond du Lac County will post and maintain a detour during the duration of the project. The eastbound detour route is CTH W (Pioneer Road) to Hickory Street to USH 151 to Main Street and back to CTH W (Pioneer Road). The westbound detour route will be the reverse of the eastbound detour route.

10-1-11 fdl police law of the month

The Fond du Lac Police Department's October Law of the Month is passing stopped emergency vehicles, tow trucks, and highway machinery equipment. The Fond du Lac Police Department wants to educate everyone on how to safely pass stopped emergency vehicles, tow trucks, or highway machinery/construction equipment (snow plows, waste management vehicles, lawn cutting equipment). The Department of Transportation traffic law for passing stopped emergency vehicles, tow trucks, and highway machinery (WI Statute 346.072) states that the operator of a motor vehicle approaching a stopped authorized emergency vehicle giving a visual signal, a tow truck displaying authorized lights, or any road machinery or motor vehicle used for road construction/maintenance displaying approved lights, or is parked on or within 12 feet of a roadway, the operator shall proceed with caution by moving into a traffic lane that is not the lane nearest the stopped/standing vehicle or machinery and continue traveling in that lane until safely clear of the stopped/standing vehicle. This applies only to roadways that have two traffic lanes in the same direction. On a one lane roadway, the operator of the motor vehicle must slow their speed, maintaining a safe speed for any traffic conditions and operate at a reduced speed until completely past the stopped/standing vehicle or machinery. The Fond du Lac Police Department urges all motorists to use caution when approaching any emergency vehicles. Slow down and stay alert!
