#### 10-13-11 nine people transported to the hospital following three separate traffic crashes in fdl county

Twentythree people and 11 vehicles were involved in three separate traffic accidents in Fond du Lac County Sunday afternoon. Sheriff's Sergeant Ryan Waldschmidt says a total of nine people received significant injuries but none were considered to be life threatening. The most serious of the accidents happened shortly before 4pm on Highway 49 at County Trunk AS involving a pick-up truck and milk tanker truck. Waldschmidt says the pick-up truck occupants...a father and son from Waupun were flown by helicopter to the hospital with serious but non life threatening injuries. "Asemi-tanker truck had turned left onto a highway and there was an oncoming vehicle driving under the tanker. The vehicle basically sheared off the entire cab of the pick-up truck. So you had half of the pick-up on one side of the tanker, the tanker resting on the passenger compartment of the pick-up and the bed of the pick-up sticking out the other side of the tanker," Waldschmidt said. At 4pm Sunday rescue personnel were called to a multiple vehicle rollover crash on Highway 45 near the Northwinds Supper Club in Eden. "Acar had stopped to turn left into Northwinds Supper Club and another southbound vehicle rear-ended that car pushing it into the oncoming lane and was struck by an oncoming northbound vehicle causing the initial car that was rear-ended to roll over," Waldschmidt said. Four people were transported to Saint Agnes Hospital. Shortly after 1pm Sunday three people were injured in a six vehicle accident just north of Rosendale on Highway 26. Waldschmidt says the chain reaction crash started when a vehicle turning left into a driveway was rear-ended. "There was a second vehicle and third vehicle that stopped behind it, a fourth vehicle came along rear-ending vehicle number three, which went into number two, which rear-ended vehicle number one. There was another vehicle that stopped in traffic to avoid those four cars and that vehicle got rear-ended," Waldschmidt said. Three people were transported to Ripon Medical Center in Ripon and Mercy Medical Center in Oshkosh. Waldschmidt says while there was a steady light rain...all of the accidents appear to have been avoidable if the drivers had been paying attention. Waldschmidt says its remarkable that there were no fatalities.

#### 10-13-11 trooper makes felony drug arrest on hwy 41 in fdl county

At approximately 4:15pm Saturday, October 29, a trooper stopped a 2005 Toyota Corolla on Hwy 41 for expired registration. Upon making contact with the driver, the trooper detected the odor of marijuana. A subsequent search of the vehicle revealed approximately three and one half pounds of the plant material. The driver, a 42 year old female from Brookfield, and the 40 year old male passenger, also from Brookfield, were arrested and are expected to be charged with felony possession of a controlled substance with intent to deliver.

Saturday at 9:22 pm the Winnebago County Sheriffs Department received a report of a vehicle that was all over the road and tailgating other vehicles on USH 45, northbound from the Fond du Lac County Line. A Wisconsin State Trooper was in the area and intercepted the vehicle at Country Club Lane. The male subject was arrested for Operating a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated, 5th Offense.

#### **10-31-11 owi arrests**

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — Wisconsin State Patrol troopers have arrested two men who have 10 allegations of intoxicated driving between them. The men were arrested in separate incidents, one for fourth-offense driving while intoxicated, and the other for his sixth offense of the same charge. The State Patrol says the first suspect is a 48-year-old Oshkosh man. Oconto County deputies received a report late Friday night of a vehicle traveling northbound in the southbound lanes of Highway 41. The State Patrol says a trooper approached the man, who acknowledged drinking and driving. The other man was arrested Saturday about 5 a.m. Authorities say the 42-year-old Sun Prairie man was stopped for speeding, and eventually arrested for sixth-offense intoxicated driving.

#### **10-31-11 attic fire**

On Monday, October 31, 2011, at 4:11 a.m. the Fond du Lac Fire Department responded to a reported attic fire at 89 Marys Avenue. Upon arrival firefighters met with a resident who said a work light left on had started a small fire in the attic earlier in the evening but that he thought he had extinguished it. Crews were able to extinguish the fire, but remained on the scene for extended operations due to smoldering spot fires in the attic space. The residents were asleep at the time of the fire and were alerted by smoke alarms. There were no injuries reported. Alliant Energy responded to the scene to secure the utilities. Fond du Lac police assisted with traffic control.

#### **10-31-11 homeowner confronts burglar**

Fond du lac police say fortunately nobody was injured in a home invasion earlier this week. Police captain, Steve Klein, says a woman returned to her North Main Street home Wednesday to find a burglar inside. Klein says The suspect was wearing an orange ski mask and fled the house when the homeowner entered through a back door. "She noticed a couple things that appeared to be out of place and saw a male subject inside her residence," Klein said. "Apparently then this male subject pushed his way past the female victim and fled from the residence." Klein says when officers arrived they were not able to locate anybody in the area. He says it appears the subject did try unsuccessfully to remove some electronics items. Anyone with information is asked to call police.

#### **10-31-11 fdl police k9 officer honored**

Chief William Lamb has announced that K-9 Officer Ryan Williams was honored by the Wisconsin Law Enforcement Canine Handlers Association by receiving the Deputy David Demos Award for Excellence. Officer Williams and his partner K-9 Grendel received their award at the State Canine Handlers Conference held at the JC Plaza Hotel and Conference Center, Johnson Creek, Wisconsin on October 4, 2011. The Deputy David Demos Award for Excellence was created to honor the memory of Milwaukee County Sheriff's K-9 Deputy David Demos who was killed in the line of duty on January 25, 1997. Deputy Demos was killed when he was struck by a drunk driver while assisting a disabled motorist on a Milwaukee interstate. Since its inception, the award has only been bestowed one other time upon a K-9 Handler. Officer Williams was recognized for the strength and courage he displayed on March 20, 2011 and the days that followed the tragic shooting that took the life of fellow Fond du Lac Police Officer Craig Birkholz and critically wounded Officer Williams and his K-9 Grendel. Officer Williams received a standing ovation from those in attendance at the conference awards presentation. Chief Bill Lamb, Captain Steve Klein, fellow K-9 Officer Ben Hardgrove and members of Officer Williams's family were present to see him accept his award. Chief Lamb stated that "Officer Williams was and continues to be an inspiration to thousands of law enforcement officers throughout the State with the courage and determination he displayed with his recovery from the events of that tragic day back in March. We are very proud to have Officer Williams as part of our Department." Officer Williams and K-9 Grendel are assigned to the night shift.

#### **10-31-10 woman convicted in dodge county tavern burglaries**

One of three people charged with breaking into and burglarizing three Dodge County taverns has pleaded no contest to charges against her. 33 year old Michelle Novak of Lyndon Station entered the no contest plea to a charge of burglary this week in Dodge County Circuit Court. A sentencing hearing has been scheduled in February. A second person, 45 year old Thomas Dahlgren, pleaded guilty to two counts of burglary in September and is scheduled to be sentenced in November. A third person, 33 year old Nicholas Etter pleaded no contest to a burglary charge and was sentenced in September to five years of initial confinement and 5 years of extended supervision. The three broke into the taverns starting in January and stole cash by damaging ATMs, video games, and juke boxes, and also stole electronic items.

#### **10-31-11 fox lake man gets prison for owi injury crash**

A Fox Lake man is going to prison for injuring a number of people in a drunken driving crash in August. At a plea and sentencing hearing Thursday, 27 year old Brandon Smith pleaded no contest to a charge of operating while intoxicated causing injury as a second or more offense. Dodge County Circuit Court Judge Steven Bauer sentenced Smith to three years of initial confinement and three years of extended supervision. According to a criminal complaint, Smith's vehicle collided with an SUV carrying five people near the intersection of Highway 33 and Sunset Bay Drive. A preliminary breathalyzer test showed Smith's blood alcohol concentration at .26. The criminal complaint says Smith told authorities he drank about 30 beers in six hours before the crash.

#### **10-31-11 uw madison cost savings**

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — A new report says the University of Wisconsin-Madison can save up to \$8.5 million just by making small changes. The university hired the Huron Consulting Group to look for areas of efficiency. The consultants found a number of areas where services or expenses could be consolidated to save money. For example, Huron said this week that UW-Madison uses more than 70 email systems. It suggests consolidating the systems or perhaps moving to third-party providers. The group says that could save up to \$1 million.

#### **10-31-11 mauston man killed in two vehicle accident**

MAuston man has been killed in a two vehicle head-on traffic accident in Columbia County. The accident happened Thursday afternoon on State Highway 33 near State Highway 146, two miles north of the Village of Cambria. The Columbia County Sheriff's Department says a preliminary investigation shows that a car driven by 49 year old Chandler Palmer of Mauston crossed the centerline on Highway 33 and was struck head-on by a pickup truck. The Sheriff's Department says Palmer was pronounced dead at the scene. The pickup truck driver was transported to Divine Savior Hospital with non-life threatening injuries. The accident remains under investigation.

#### 10-31-11 concealed carry law changes proposed

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — The Legislature's rules committee is set to consider changing Wisconsin's concealed carry rules. Republican State Representatives Scott Suder and Erik Severson have sent a letter to the committee saying they're opposed to a mandate that permit applicants take at least four hours of firearms training. They want the committee to repeal the time standard.

#### 10-31-11 concealed carry-supreme court

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — Wisconsin's Supreme Court plans to discuss policies on concealed weapons in their state Capitol chambers next month. The state's new concealed carry law goes into effect Tuesday. The statutes generally prohibit the public from bringing hidden weapons into courthouses, but allow judges and prosecutors to pack.

#### 10-31-11 venture capitol plan

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — Governor Scott Walker is endorsing an outline of a plan to increase by \$100 million the amount of venture capital available to startup companies in Wisconsin. Walker announced the framework Friday. Walker's plan calls for the state investing in other existing investment funds, not directly in companies.

#### 10-31-11 legislative boundaries

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — A Republican-backed bill being circulated for co-sponsors in the Legislature would put new legislative boundaries that favor the GOP in effect starting a year sooner. The bill circulated today by Republican Senator Mary Lazich would make the new districts take effect for purposes of recall elections starting November 9th. Democrats want the Republicans to run in their current districts.

#### 10-31-11 lawyer says he will no longer represent republican clients

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — An Milwaukee attorney known as the country's king of lemon law litigation says he will no longer represent any Republican clients. Vince Megna tells The Associated Press today that he has already turned down one potential client. Megna is upset with a bill that passed the Senate yesterday that mandates attorneys' fees no greater than three times awarded damages.

#### 10-31-11 political corruption case

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — A legislative aide accused of raising campaign funds for Republican candidates while on the state payroll has pleaded guilty. Fifty-nine-year-old Sherry Schultz was placed in a deferred prosecution program this week in Dane County. She's the last defendant to settle a nine year-old political corruption case.

#### 10-31-11 another top administrator leaves dwd post

MILWAUKEE (AP) — A top administrator at the Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development has left her position, marking the agency's third high-profile departure in less than a year. ADWD spokesman said today that Allison Rozek is no longer the administrator of the Administrative Services Division. He says she left this week but he didn't know whether she resigned or was fired.

**10-31-11 leaf collection**

The City of Fond du Lac's annual leaf collection will begin on Monday October 17, 2010 with crews starting in the northeast section of the city. The collection will proceed in a clockwise direction - to the southeast, southwest, and northwest sections. The leaf collection process will continue for six weeks, ending on Friday, November 25. Again this year there will be a map available on the City's website indicating the progress that collection crews have made to date. On the website, click on Leaf Collection Progress Map, and you can see which areas have been covered by collection crews, and arrows indicating in which direction the crews will be moving. The map will be updated toward the end of each work day. A sample of the map is available now at <http://www.ci.fond-du-lac.wi.us/>. For collection purposes, Main Street divides the city into east and west halves, and Western Avenue and Fourth Street divide the city into north and south halves. The Public Works Department anticipates that crews will complete approximately two clockwise sweeps through the city this fall, weather and time permitting. During the first round of collection,

raking by the crew is limited. As an alternative to the collection, residents may haul their leaves to the City's yard waste drop off site located on the north side of the Municipal Service Center located at 530 Doty Street. Bags must be emptied and disposed of properly at the site.

- **Leaves should be raked in rows next to the curb for collection by City crews. Please do not rake leaves into the street.**
- **City crews will not pick up leaves in plastic bags.**
- **Park vehicles and garbage carts away from leaf windrows.**
- **Your garbage cart is for garbage only. Please do not place leaves inside the automated garbage collection carts.**
- **Cut garden material such as vines and corn stalks into lengths of one foot or less.**
- **Fruit and vegetables (such as apples or pumpkins) will not be collected. These should be disposed of at the City's yard waste drop off site on Doty Street. Some streets are still under construction at this time.**

City crews will make every effort to get in to those areas still under construction, or will make a thorough cleanup later in the season after the construction is completed.

#### **A Green Alternative: Leave 'em Lay!**

As an alternative to raking leaves to the curb, residents are encouraged to try chopping up moderate amounts of leaves with a lawnmower. This can be done during normal lawn mowing. Just don't allow the leaves to mat and make sure that ample grass shows through them. This will save you work and time, add nutrients to your lawn, reduce windblown leaves in your neighborhood and reduce the amount of labor and fuel the City needs to use for leaf collection. If you really like to rake, composting your leaves in a backyard garden is another alternative which will provide you with useful organic material next year. Anyone who wishes to receive full seven cubic yard loads of leaves should contact the Municipal Service Center at 322-3544.

#### **10-31-11 temporary bridge closure**

On Monday morning, October 31, the Scott Street (USH 45) Bridge at the Fond du Lac River will be closed to all vehicular traffic for about two weeks while the concrete bridge deck is patched. At least one sidewalk crossing the bridge will remain open to pedestrians at all times. The bridge location is immediately west of Brooke Street. Bus service on Scott Street will be moved to Arndt Street from Brooke Street to Hickory Street. A detour route for USH 45 will be marked from USH 45 southbound to Scott Street; west on Scott Street; south on Hickory Street and east on Johnson Street to Main Street. The northbound detour will be marked from Main Street; west on Johnson Street; north on Hickory Street and east on Scott Street to USH 45 north. #### **10-31-11 highway t closure**

County Highway T from Nelson Rd to Townline Rd will be closed starting October 5, 2011 to reconstruct the bridge over a branch of the West Branch Fond du Lac River in the Town of Lamartine. Construction to replace the load posted and structurally deficient bridge is expected to be completed by mid November, weather permitting. The highway will be closed to all traffic and a detour will be posted via County Highway T (Esterbrook Road), State Highway 23, and County Highway Y.

**Location: Morris Street to Main Street**

**Description:** The project involves the reconstruction of CTH W (Pioneer Road) between Morris Street and Main Street, the reconstruction of the Pioneer Road bridge over the East Branch of the Fond du Lac River and the construction of the Wild Goose Prairie Trail within the project limits.

**October 24 to October 28:** Bridge contractor will form up and pour parapet walls and sidewalk on the bridge. Paving contractor will pour the eastbound & westbound lanes on the west half of the project, they will form up and pour approach slabs, sidewalks, driveways and the intersection at Woodbine Park Road. Asphalt contractor will pave sections of the recreational trail.

**October 31 to November 4:** Bridge contractor will remove forms from the bridge deck and work on polishing the bridge. Paving contractor will work on forming & pouring driveways and sidewalks. Asphalt contractor will asphalt miscellaneous areas on the project. Grading contractor will work on topsoiling the project. Landscape contractor will seed, fertilize and emat, install signs and guardrail. Pavement marking will be done.

**Traffic impacts:** CTH W (Pioneer Road) will be closed to through traffic for the duration of the project.

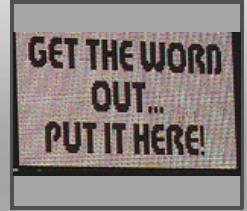
Local traffic will have access during the project except when construction is taking place in immediately in

the vicinity of their residence or business. The contractor will coordinate with residents and businesses prior to any closures.

**Detour Route:** Fond du Lac County will post and maintain a detour during the duration of the project. The eastbound detour route is CTH W (Pioneer Road) to Hickory Street to USH 151 to Main Street and back to CTH W (Pioneer Road). The westbound detour route will be the reverse of the eastbound detour route.

During the fall harvest season, more farm equipment will be on rural Wisconsin roads and highways so motorists will need to be especially alert, focused and patient. To share the road safely, drivers should slow down immediately whenever they see a fluorescent orange slow-moving vehicle emblem on the rear of a tractor or other piece of agricultural equipment. They also must be extremely cautious while trying to pass slow-moving vehicles. You should not pass a slow-moving vehicle if you cannot see clearly in front of the vehicle you intend to pass or you are in a designated no passing zone. Farmers and others using animal-drawn vehicles on a roadway have the same rights and duties as operators of motor vehicles. You should be careful not to frighten the animals. Do not sound your horn or flash your lights near them, and give the animals plenty of room when passing. For their part, farmers and other operators of slow-moving vehicles must follow safety regulations. According to state
