9-17-11 beveridge trial adjourned

The trial for the former Fond du Lac Management Information Systems director scheduled to begin Monday has been postponed. Judge Peter Grimm granted a motion to adjourn the trial for Mark Beveridge after the District Attorney presented defense attorney Mike O'Rourke with some 200 pages of new discovery Friday. Beveridge faces multiple counts of misconduct in office, forgery and theft. He is accused of participating in a scheme using taxpayer money to purchase mostly electronics items for personal use. O'Rourke says he needed more time to prepare with the new discovery landing on his desk...one working day before the trial was scheduled to begin. "There's two ways to look at this. The DA says he had just gotten this material and had turned it over to me as soon as he got it, and if that's the case then fair enough, but I still need time to review it," O'Rourke said. "The other theory would be is that someone, either the DA or the city withheld this material to the last moment in order to prejudice my client." Four other former MIS employees have been convicted...but Beveridge has maintained his innocence.

9-17-11 da charges beveridge with bail jumping

The Fond du Lac County District Attorney has filed a new charge against a former Fond du Lac city official accused of stealing taxpayer money for his personal use. DA Dan Kaminsky has charged former Fond du Lac MIS Director, Mark Beveridge, with bail jumping after Beveridge applied for the purchase of a handgun recently. Beveridge said he didn't realize it's against the law to purchase a gun if you are accused of a crime. His attorney, Mike O'Rourke, says he's also not sure if his client can be charged. "If you've been indicted for a felony you can't possess a firearm. Technically Mr. Beveridge has not been indicted for a felony because in Wisconsin we use the information system not the indictment system." O'Rourke says it didn't cross Beveridge's mind that he was doing something wrong when he saw that Cabela's was having a sale on guns and decided to buy one. "It was a good deal. He's a hunter, he owns handguns and Cabela's had a sale," O'Rourke said. "It never occurred to him that this was a problem."

9-17-11 former fdl track and cross country coach placed on probation

A former Fond du Lac High School math teacher and cross country and track coach will spend some time in jail. Fond du Lac judge, Gary Sharpe, has placed 35 year old Henry Dennis on three years probation with six months conditional jail time for having sexual contact with a female student. The judge also ordered that Dennis write a letter to school districts around the state offering to speak to coaches and staff about his situation and the devastation it caused for everybody involved. Dennis must also register as a lifetime sex offender. As part of the plea deal Dennis will never be able to teach or coach students again. Fond du Lac police say a woman who was initially issued an inattentive driving citation and later arrested for operating while intoxicated was apparently impaired by prescription medication. Police Captain Steve Klein says under the circumstances officer Matt Bobo was correct in issuing the woman the citation and letting her go. Klein says the woman was later arrested in Calumet County after officer Bobo contacted them when he heard over the police radio the woman was still driving erratically and headed in their direction. But Klein says following the initial stop in Fond du Lac, he thinks even a trained Drug Recognition Expert officer would have done the same thing.

9-17-11 man killed in green lake county vehicle accident

One man was killed in a two vehicle, head on collision in Green Lake County Friday. The Green Lake County Sheriff's Department says a mini-van crossed the center line on Highway 23 and struck a truck head on. The accident happened just east of Sunnyside Road in the town of Brooklyn. The driver of the mini van was pronounced dead at the scene.

9-17-11 woman leads police on chase

A Fond du lac woman was arrested following a police chase where she ran over a woman's foot and hit a police squad car. Police received a report of a reckless driver in the area of West Johnson Street and Military Road. Police say when a passing motorist stopped to check on the driver of a van stopped on the Johnson Street bridge, the van driver drove away, running over the woman's foot. When an officer tried to stop the van near the Police Department at Main and Rees streets the driver traveled through a parking lot and then south on Main Street. A sheriff's sergeant later rammed the back panel of the van causing the vehicle to spin out...travel over the curb and through the yards of homes on Johnson near Military and Doty. The woman stopped the van near Johnson and Macy Streets and backed into a police squad. She was transported to the Health Care Center for observation.

9-17-11 convenience store robbery suspect reaches plea deal

One of three suspects in a Fond du Lac convenience store robbery has copped a plea. Thaddeus Chishom pleaded no contest to an amended charge of party to the crime of felon in possession of a firearm...and two counts of harboring or aiding a felon. Chishom was initially charged with armed robbery in connection with the Kwik Trip gas station robbery at gunpoint. A pre-sentence investigation was ordered.

9-17-11 bank robbery suspect arraigned

A Fond du Lac bank robbery suspect has pleaded not guilty. Twenty two year old Deangelo Hull entered the plea to a charge of robbery of a financial institution at his arraignment hearing in Fond du Lac County Circuit Court. The Milwaukee man is charged in connection with the robbery at Hometown Bank near downtown Fond du lac. According to a criminal complaint Hull handed the teller a note stating he had a bomb and then fled with nearly \$17,000 in cash.

9-17-11 new calumet county circuit court judge

Governor Walker announced today that he has selected Jeffrey Froehlich to serve as the next judge for the Circuit Court in Calumet County. Mr. Froehlich starts his tenure as judge after having served the people of Calumet County for over ten years. "The judiciary must be comprised of men and women who faithfully guard the state and federal constitutions, and who humbly say what the law is and subordinate their personal views to the law," Governor Walker said. Mr. Froehlich received his undergraduate education from the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point, where he earned a Bachelors of Science in Biology. He then went on to receive a juris doctor from the University of Wisconsin Law School. Mr. Froehlich brings to the position almost fifteen years of legal experience. He began his career as a law clerk and court commissioner in Oneida and Vilas Counties. He not only performed legal research in a range of areas of the law, but also conducted bail hearings, evaluated complaints for probable cause, and facilitated alternative dispute resolution in small claims actions. Mr. Froehlich then began his career as a prosecutor, first working as a Public Service Special Prosecutor for Outagamie County, and then as an Assistant District Attorney for Calumet County. For over a decade Mr. Froehlich has conducted trials and hearings, prepared filings for the court, and helped the people of Calumet interact with the county's legal system. Mr. Froehlich's appointment will stand until a judge has been sworn in following the April 2012 spring elections. Mr. Froehlich has the opportunity to run for this seat.

MILWAUKEE (AP) — Governor Scott Walker says he doesn't know anything about an FBI raid on the home of one of his top aides beyond what he's seen reported in the press. Walker said today that "it's hard to tell" whether he should be concerned about the raid on the home of Cynthia Archer. Archer was his aide when he was Milwaukee County executive and followed him to work in state government when he was elected governor.

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — Former Congressman Mark Green is backing ex-Wisconsin Governor Tommy Thompson for the U.S. Senate. Thompson hasn't formally announced his candidacy, but he is racking up support from Republican Party leaders.

9-17-11 suicide prevention

The Fond du Lac Area TeenScreen program is seeking to improve awareness of the issue of suicide and its effects on the whole community. TeenScreen is a free, confidential mental health check-up which is offered to all 9th graders in high schools throughout Fond du Lac County. Additionally, the TeenScreen check-up is offered at Agnesian HealthCare - Fond du Lac Regional Clinic and Aurora Health Care. To date, TeenScreen has screened over 6000 students in our local communities helping to identify youth at risk for depression, anxiety, alcohol and substance abuse and suicide. The program has referred over 1,000 students to needed services.

Suicide Facts: In the 2011 Fond du Lac School District Student Health Survey, 13% of 8th, 10th & 11th grade respondents reported they have seriously considered suicide. This is a significant decrease from a high of 26% in 2004. Seven percent of the respondents state that they have attempted suicide, which has stayed relatively the same over the years.

What can you do if you are concerned about a student or youth? When your 9th grader brings home the TeenScreen permission slip and brochure, take time to read through this important information and return the permission slip to school so that your child can be screened. TeenScreen is offered every school year throughout Fond du Lac County. This year, TeenScreen is enhancing our suicide prevention efforts with a training to anyone in the Fond du Lac area that has contact with youth. This includes parents, family members, friends, pastors, school staff, and coaches, virtually anyone who has a young person in their lives that they care about. The training, called QPR stands for Question a person about suicide, Persuade the person to get help and Refer the person to the appropriate resource. The training is one to two hours in length and will be offered at several locations in September and throughout the school year. QPR is for everyone in the community and is free of charge.

9-17-11 division street closure

On Monday morning, September 19, the Division Street Bridge at Deneveu Creek will be closed to all vehicular traffic for about three weeks while the concrete bridge deck is resurfaced. At least one sidewalk crossing the bridge will remain open to pedestrians except for about one day while the concrete deck is being placed. The bridge location is east of St Agnes Hospital between Reid Terrace and Oaklawn Avenue. St Agnes Hospital will not be accessible from the east on Division Street. The Hospital is accessible from National Avenue on Second Street and from Park Avenue along Division Street from the west. Bus service on Division Street will be moved to Merrill Avenue from Oaklawn Avenue to the east.

9-17-11 highway c construction

Crews have begun construction on County Trunk Highway C from West Branch Fond du Lac River to CTH N in the Town of Eldorado. Paving is expected to start September 12, weather permitting. The Fond du Lac County Highway department will replace culverts, resurface the pavement, and complete other minor work on the project. The project is anticipated to be completed by the end of September. The highway will generally be open during construction with lane closures and flaggers. Expect delays. Occasionally there may be temporary closures with local detours.

9-17-11 west pioneer road reconstruction update

CTH W; West Pioneer Road Reconstruction

Schedule: July 2011 to November 2011

Length: 0.213 miles

Cost: \$1,848,192.39

Location: Morris Street to Main Street

Description: The project involves the reconstruction of CTH W (Pioneer Road) between Morris Street and Main Street, the reconstruction of the Pioneer Road bridge over the East Branch of the Fond du Lac River and the construction of the Wild Goose Prairie Trail within the project limits. Crew will install backfill structure & heavy riprap at the west abutment.

September 12 to September 16: Bridge crew will continue to form and tie rebar for the southern half of the west abutment. The southern half will be poured this week. Crew will begin driving piling for the east abutment. Crew will tie rebar and form up the east abutment.

September 19 to September 23: Crew will pour the east abutment. Girders will be delivered and installed. Grading crew will be on site grading the roadway on the east side of the project from the FDL River to the east project limits.

Traffic impacts: CTH W (Pioneer Road) will be closed to through traffic for the duration of the project.

Local traffic will have access during the project except when construction is taking place in immediately in the vicinity of their residence or business. The contractor will coordinate with residents and businesses prior to any closures.

Detour Route: Fond du Lac County will post and maintain a detour during the duration of the project. The eastbound detour route is CTH W (Pioneer Road) to Hickory Street to USH 151 to Main Street and back to CTH W (Pioneer Road). The westbound detour route will be the reverse of the eastbound detour route.

All Fond du Lac County residents, farmers, school districts, and businesses are invited to participate, including all residents of the City of Waupun. There will be a one-time \$5 per vehicle (cash only) charge for all participants, regardless of the type or quantity of materials brought. 5R Processors, Ltd. of Ladysmith, WI will be collecting electronics for recycling at this event. Businesses are asked to contact 5R Processors directly at 715/532-2050 to receive a cost estimate. K-12 school districts with electronics are required to pre-register by calling the Fond du Lac County UW-Extension office at 920/929-3173. All other participants can bring electronics without pre-registering. For a fee of \$10 (cash only), 5R Processors will do a Department of Defense-approved hard drive wipe and send a certificate of data destruction to you after it is completed. To expedite this process, please come with your name and address written legibly on an index card. This event will be a collection of electronics of all kinds. Additionally, 5R will accept microwaves, vacuum cleaners, ovens, dishwashers, washing machines, and dryers at this event. No hazardous chemicals, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, freezers, refrigerators, explosives, batteries, or light bulbs will be accepted. Volunteers will be needed throughout the day to lift and unload heavy electronics from vehicles, stack and wrap pallets, and survey participants. Volunteers will receive refreshments and may bring their own electronics for recycling at no cost.
