#### 8-29-11 fdl man arrested in new london robbery

A 25-year-old Fond du Lac man is awaiting charges for allegedly robbing the Festival Foods Liquor Store in New London at gunpoint. New London Police Chief Jeff Schlueter says the incident happened Sunday morning around 10:30. The suspect pointed a gun at the cashier, demanded money and got away with about \$300. Within minutes, police located the man and took him into custody. The Chief says they recovered the stolen money and the gun. The suspect has been identified as Jesse Mahsem – he's currently sitting in the Waupaca County Jail.

#### 8-29-11 wolf lake beach reopens for the weekend

On Friday August 26, 2011 the Fond du Lac County Code Enforcement Office removed the beach closed signs and posted precautionary signs. A water test collected at the swimming beach on August 25 tested below 235 e. coli per 100 ml'. Code Enforcement will resume weekly testing of Wolf Lake's beach water. Water quality testing is done as a precaution to alert swimmers when bacteria levels are high which puts swimmers at an increase risk for developing gastrointestinal illnesses. 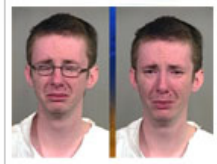

State Senator Jessica King has been sworn into office. The Oshkosh Democrat took the oath of office Friday to officially begin her duties as 18th District state senator. State Supreme Court Chief Justice Shirley Abrahamson presided over the ceremony in Oshkosh. King defeated Republican Randy Hopper of Fond du lac in a recall election earlier this month. Hopper was one of six republican senators recalled over their vote in favor of a budget repair bill that removed collective bargaining rights for most public workers. King says she looks forward to standing up for middle class and working families, seniors and students.

#### **8-29-11 fdl woman accused of having sex with two boys bound over for trial**

A 37 year old former Fond du lac woman accused of sexually assaulting two 17 year old boys has been bound over for trial. Probable cause was found at a preliminary hearing Friday for Amelia Fay. Fay, who now lives in Menomonie, is charged with seven misdemeanor counts of sex with a child age 16 or older. She is accused of having sexual intercourse with two boys at her Fond du lac residence between 2010 and earlier this year.

#### **8-29-11 fdl man charged with child sex assault**

A Fond du lac judge is expected to make a ruling next week on whether there is probable cause to go to trial in a child sex assault case. A preliminary hearing was held Friday for 39 year old Oscar Ramirez on two counts of first degree sexual assault of a child. Judge Gary Sharpe is scheduled to issue an oral ruling on probable cause next Tuesday.

#### **8-29-11 prosser-bradley**

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — Wisconsin Supreme Court Justice David Prosser told detectives he put his hands on Justice Ann Walsh Bradley's neck to ward her off after she charged him and put her fist in his face. Investigators who looked into Walsh Bradley's allegations that she was choked have released an interview with Prosser. A special prosecutor says she won't file criminal charges in the case.

#### **8-29-11 pinno motion denied**

A Fond du Lac woman convicted of covering up for her son after he killed his girlfriend and helping him dispose of the body was back in court Friday. Fond du lac Judge, Richard Nuss denied a motion by Nancy Pinno's attorney to recuse the District Attorney from the appeal process. Pinno is appealing her conviction of mutilating a corpse and obstructing an officer. She is serving a prison sentence at the Iowa Correctional Institution in Mitchellville, Iowa. Pinno is the mother of Brandon Mueller. Mueller was convicted of killing Renee Redmer at Pinno's Fond du lac apartment, burning the remains at a Van Dyne property and dumping the ashes in Lake Winnebago.

#### **8-29-11 nfdl woman charged with 8th owi waives prelim**

A North Fond du lac woman has been bound over for trial on her 8th owi. Elizabeth Liefke waived her preliminary hearing Friday in Fond du Lac county circuit court. Liefke was arrested August 17th while she was driving only 35 miles an hour on Highway 151 near Kiekhafer Parkway.

#### **8-29-11 sentencing set for oshkosh man convicted of sexually assaulting ripon girl**

A sentencing hearing is set for an Oshkosh man convicted of sexually assaulting a Ripon girl. Twenty eight year old, Jonathon Petroski, entered an Alford plea to a charge of first degree sexual assault of a child. An Alford plea is when a defendant does not admit guilt but believes the prosecution could likely prove the charge. A charge of exposing a child to harmful materials was dismissed and read into the record. According to a criminal complaint Petroski sexually assaulted a six year old Ripon girl in 2006 and 2007. Petroski was previously convicted of child sex assault in Green Lake County in 2003. He remains in jail on \$25,000 cash bond. He faces up to 70 years in prison when he is sentenced December 6th.

#### **8-29-11 top official in walker administration leaving**

MILWAUKEE (AP) — Another top official in Governor Scott Walker's administration is leaving. Cindy Archer has been the deputy secretary for the Department of Administration after being one of Walker's top aides when he was Milwaukee County executive. Archer says she needs to tend to "personal family matters" and will return to state government after a leave of absence.

#### **8-29-11 milk production down**

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — The rate of milk production continues to decline in Wisconsin and Minnesota. Dairy farmers in Wisconsin harvested 2.2 million pounds last month, which amounts to a four percent decrease. Milk production is still on the rise in the rest of the country, which saw a one percent increase last month from the year before.

#### **8-29-11 wisconsin angler hooks prosthetic leg**

ALEXANDRIA, Minn. (AP) — A Wisconsin angler has fished out a prosthetic leg a Minnesota woman lost while swimming three years ago. Beth Krohn was fishing in Alexandria, Minn., last month when says her line caught the leg. Krohn eventually tracked down the limb's owner, Pam Riley, and returned the leg.

#### **8-29-11 2011 wisconsin waterfowl hunting seasons set**

MADISON — The Natural Resources Board set 2011 waterfowl season dates and bag limits and approved creation of a third waterfowl hunting zone at its meeting today in Spring Green.

"Waterfowl hunters can look forward to a full 60-day duck season with a six-duck daily bag, and an 85-day exterior goose zone season," said Kent Van Horn, Department of Natural Resources waterfowl ecologist. "It was a good year for duck production in Wisconsin and across the continent. Overall conditions were very good for breeding ducks. The continental breeding duck estimates hit a record level at 45.6 million ducks making 2011 good year to be a duck hunter. "As always, the most successful hunters will be the ones doing the early season scouting, locating the smaller isolated potholes that can attract waterfowl when hunting pressure is high in other areas and securing permissions from landowners well in advance," added Van Horn. "I'd like to thank the thousands of hunters who participated in the development of our new duck hunting zones and wish all waterfowl hunters a successful and safe season."

#### **2011 waterfowl season structure**

During the 60-day season duck season, the daily bag limit is six ducks in total. The six-duck total may include no more than four mallards, of which only one can be a hen, three wood ducks, two redheads, one

black duck, two pintail, two scaup and one canvasback. In addition, five mergansers to include not more than two hooded mergansers. Coot daily bag of 15. (For duck species not listed such as teal and ring-necked ducks, the combined total with all other species may not exceed six ducks).

**Northern Zone**-Sept. 24 at 9 a.m.-Nov. 22.

**Southern Zone**-Oct. 1 at 9 a.m.-Oct. 9, and Oct. 15-Dec. 4.

**Mississippi River Zone**-Sept. 24 at 9 a.m. - Oct. 2, Oct. 15-Dec. 4 (12 day split Oct 3-14),

**Youth Waterfowl Hunt**

The youth waterfowl hunt will be Sept. 17-18. Youth may harvest Canada geese in all zones during these 2 days. All bag limits and tag requirements apply for the zone hunted. These days overlap with open goose seasons in most areas so adults will also be able to harvest geese but not ducks during the youth hunt.

**Canada geese**

The state is apportioned into two goose hunting zones: Horicon and Exterior. Other goose management subzones within the Exterior Zone include Brown County and the Mississippi River.

**Exterior Zone:** 85 days. Daily bag of two Canada geese.

**North Zone:** Sept. 16-23 and Sept. 24, (9a.m.)-Dec. 9.

**South Zone:** September 16-30, October 1 (9 a.m.)-Oct. 9 and Oct. 15-Dec. 14.

**Mississippi River Subzone:** Sept. 24 (9a.m.)-Oct. 2, Oct. 15-Dec. 29.

**Horicon Time Periods:** Hunters with Horicon zone permits will be issued six tags for the time period that they are awarded. The daily bag limit will be two geese with a possession limit of six.

**Horicon:** 92 days Period 1 Sept. 16-Oct. 30, Period 2 Oct. 31-Dec. 16

**Other Geese:** Brant and Light geese Seasons will be the same as for the Canada goose zones/subzones. The daily bag limit will be one brant and 20 snow, blue or Ross' geese. White fronted geese season will be the same as Canada geese for the Exterior zone and within the Horicon zone the season will be from Sept. 20-Dec. 16. The daily bag limit will be one.

**Third Waterfowl hunting zone added**

The new three-zone season structure adds a third waterfowl zone to the existing northern and southern duck zones. The new third zone consists of the Mississippi River from roughly Prescott to the Wisconsin - Illinois border, west of the railroad, and is identical to the current Mississippi River Canada goose subzone. What is now identified as the Mississippi River Zone for duck hunters will open Sept. 24 - Oct. 2; reopening Oct 15 through Dec. 4. Goose seasons in this zone will continue through Dec. 29.

**Mentored Hunting**

Wisconsin's mentored hunting law allows any registered hunter age 18 and older to introduce anyone age 10 and older to hunting without the mentee first passing a hunter safety education course. It's a great way to generate excitement and interest in adding hunting to a lifestyle. Interested hunters can learn more at the Mentored Hunting Law page of the DNR website.
