8-2-11 man convicted in fdl county of owi 7th offense

Aman convicted of his 7th OWI in Fond du lac County is going to prison. Fond du Lac Judge, Peter Grimm, sentenced 47 year old Robert Nelson to three years in prison and five years extended supervision. Nelson pleaded no contest to OWI 7th offense. In addition to prison, Judge Grimm ordered several conditions including that Nelson pay for the installation of an ignition interlock device in his vehicle.

8-2-11 waupun tavern fight

Two people were seriously injured in a fight outside a Waupun tavern over the weekend. Police Chief, Dale Heeringa, says the incident happened outside the Thirsty Marlin bar on East Main Street. Two people were transported to the hospital. A Horicon man was arrested and Heeringa says police are still looking for a second suspect.

8-2-11 malpractice fund settlement

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — Gov. Scott Walker says the state of Wisconsin has repaid a medical malpractice fund \$233 million after a raid in 2007 done to help balance the budget. Walker announced the payment Tuesday in Green Bay. The state reached an agreement last month with the Wisconsin Medical Society over the final payment after the state Supreme Court ruled a year ago that the state had to pay the money back. The payment made Tuesday included the \$200 million taken from the fund plus \$34 million in lost earnings and interest. The patients' compensation fund was raided under a bipartisan deal reached with then-Gov. Jim Doyle and the Legislature. The Medical Society successfully argued that taking the money from the fund used to help pay malpractice claims was unconstitutional.

8-2-11 hot air balloon accident



The Dodge County Sheriff says its fortunate that a weekend balloon incident wasn't more serious than it was. Four people received minor injuries and a woman suffered a broken arm, when a sudden, strong gust of wind dragged a balloon along the ground at a fundraising event in Dodge County. Sheriff Todd Nehls says its fortunate that the balloon wasn't in the air at the time. The hot air balloon company was giving feathered rides to people at a fundraising event Saturday afternoon.

8-2-11 farm exports

MILWAUKEE (AP) — Wisconsin farm exports increased 36 percent last year. The state says exports earned a record \$2.4 billion in sales in 2010. Only Texas and Tennessee farm exports are growing at a better rate than Wisconsin.
