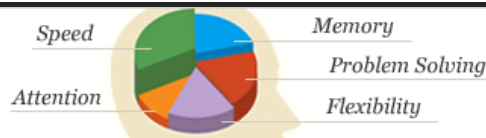

9-13-11 police shooting investigation

The Fond du lac County District Attorney says while an investigation determined that a former Fond du lac police officer had a relationship with the girlfriend of a gunman who killed a police officer...it was probably not the motivating factor in a shooting incident last spring. District Attorney Dan Kaminsky released a summary of a state justice department report involving the March 20th shooting incident. At a press conference Monday afternoon Kaminsky reiterated that James Cruckson shot and killed officer Craig Birkholz before turning the gun on himself. WFDL news earlier broke the story that a police officer had a relationship with Cruckson's girlfriend. But Kaminsky said Cruckson was upset over another affair he believed his girlfriend was having with a foreign exchange student. "It really doesn't matter in my mind what his (Cruckson's) motivation was. There's no justification or excuse for what happened," Kaminsky said. "Two recorded phone conversations where Cruckson acknowledged his motivation was a belief that there was infidelity with a foreign exchange student, numerous recorded phone conversations with a police officer in which Mr. Cruckson admitted the sexual assault (of his girlfriend) and not once did he mention his desire for revenge." Meanwhile, police chief Bill Lamb says six months after the shooting incident...the department continues to heal. "We're working to get through the healing process. It hasn't been all that long and the healing and grieving process takes time," Lamb said. The press conference can be heard in its entirety on AM 1170 WFDL's Between the Lines program at 9:10am Tuesday.

9-13-11 sex assault suspect bound over for trial

A Fond du Lac man accused of attacking a Fond du Lac woman in her apartment has been bound over for trial. Probable cause has been found at a preliminary hearing for 37 year old Shannon Parker. Parker is charged as a repeat offender with robbery, sexual assault, false imprisonment, identity theft and misdemeanor battery. A criminal complaint says Parker entered the 53 year old woman's Morningside Drive apartment where he sexually assaulted her, stole her credit card and ripped her phone out of the wall. According to the complaint Parker told officers he had been abusing prescription medication, was doing cocaine and was huffing gasoline.

9-13-11 coast guard rescues toddler from lake michigan

SHEBOYGAN, Wis. (AP) — The U.S. Coast Guard has rescued a four-year-old boy from Lake Michigan near Sheboygan. Officials say the boy was on a raft with his father and that the father got off to swim. A sudden current carried the raft away from the father, and eventually pulled the boy 300 feet off of shore.

9-13-11 fdl bicyclist injured in collision with police squad car

An 18 year old Fond du Lac man escaped serious injury when his bicycle collided with a police squad car.

9-13-11 mold temporarily closes orchestra room at fdl high school

The orchestra room at the Fond du lac High School has reopened after mold was found in a storage closet. Superintendent Doctor Jim Sebert says a small amount of mold was found last week. "We were proactive in trying to remediate that and get rid of it," Sebert said. "We had our environmental management consultant take a look at it. It was a mildewy, moldy, very small spot." The orchestra room was reopened to students Monday.

9-13-11 cats removed from fdl home-update

The Fond du Lac animal shelter manager says she doesn't think a Fond du lac man should be allowed to own pets after more than two dozen cats were removed from his home last week. Shelter Manager, Renee Webb, says 25 cats and kittens were removed from the house at 183 West 12th Street where she describes the conditions as "horrific." Webb says all of the cats are being treated for "very contagious" ringworm.

9-13-11 recall opinion

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — The state Government Accountability Board is asking the attorney general's office to give a legal opinion on whether a recall targeting the governor would include the lieutenant governor. Democrats say they intend to seek a recall of Governor Scott Walker next year, but they have not targeted Lieutenant Governor Rebecca Kleefisch.

9-13-11 student id cards

MADISON, Wis. (AP) — Student identification cards could get special stickers on them under the law taking effect next year that requires voters to show photo ID. The stickers would indicate when the student cards were issued and when they expire in order to be used for voting. The Government Accountability Board decided today to allow for the stickers.

9-13-11 suicide prevention week

The Fond du Lac Area TeenScreen program is seeking to improve awareness of the issue of suicide and its effects on the whole community. TeenScreen is a free, confidential mental health check-up which is offered to all 9th graders in high schools throughout Fond du Lac County. Additionally, the TeenScreen check-up is offered at Agnesian HealthCare - Fond du Lac Regional Clinic and Aurora Health Care. To date, TeenScreen has screened over 6000 students in our local communities helping to identify youth at risk for depression, anxiety, alcohol and substance abuse and suicide. The program has referred over 1,000 students to needed services.

Suicide Facts: In the 2011 Fond du Lac School District Student Health Survey, 13% of 8th, 10th & 11th grade respondents reported they have seriously considered suicide. This is a significant decrease from a high of 26% in 2004. Seven percent of the respondents state that they have attempted suicide, which has stayed relatively the same over the years.

What can you do if you are concerned about a student or youth? When your 9th grader brings home the TeenScreen permission slip and brochure, take time to read through this important information and return the permission slip to school so that your child can be screened. TeenScreen is offered every school year throughout Fond du Lac County. This year, TeenScreen is enhancing our suicide prevention efforts with a training to anyone in the Fond du Lac area that has contact with youth. This includes parents, family members, friends, pastors, school staff, and coaches, virtually anyone who has a young person in their lives that they care about. The training, called QPR stands for Question a person about suicide, Persuade the person to get help and Refer the person to the appropriate resource. The training is one to two hours in length and will be offered at several locations in September and throughout the school year. QPR is for everyone in the community and is free of charge.

9-13-11 highway c construction

Crews have begun construction on County Trunk Highway C from West Branch Fond du Lac River to CTH N in the Town of Eldorado. Paving is expected to start September 12, weather permitting. The Fond du Lac County Highway department will replace culverts, resurface the pavement, and complete other minor work on the project. The project is anticipated to be completed by the end of September. The highway will generally be open during construction with lane closures and flaggers. Expect delays. Occasionally there may be temporary closures with local detours.

9-13-11 railroad crossing repairs

On Monday September 12, the Department of Public Works will close Western Ave. from Superior St. to Hickory St. to assist with repairs to the railroad crossing. No detour will be set up during this work, and the street is expected to be reopened to traffic on Thursday September 15.

9-13-11 division street temporary closure

Division Street is scheduled to be closed to through traffic for about a week for asphalt resurfacing from Park Avenue to Oaklawn Avenue beginning early Wednesday morning, September 7. Division Street from Portland Street to Park Avenue is scheduled to be closed the following week for asphalt resurfacing. Bus service on Division Street will be moved to Merrill Avenue from Marr Street to the east. Bus service will be moved to Sheboygan Street from Main Street to Marr Street. Access to adjacent properties on Park Avenue will be maintained during construction. Traffic without a home or business destination within the construction project on Park Avenue should avoid using the street to help protect the construction workers, reduce inconvenience to adjacent properties and to avoid potential damage to vehicles. Park Avenue and Oaklawn Avenue will not be part of the road work however all non-construction traffic access to Division Street at these two points and at Marr Street will be closed. Local traffic may access Division Street from local side streets except while an intersection is closed for construction work. One lane of thru traffic will be maintained at all times on Marr Street (USH 45).

9-13-11 west pioneer road reconstruction update

CTH W; West Pioneer Road Reconstruction

Schedule: July 2011 to November 2011

Length: 0.213 miles

Cost: \$1,848,192.39

Location: Morris Street to Main Street

Description: The project involves the reconstruction of CTH W (Pioneer Road) between Morris Street and Main Street, the reconstruction of the Pioneer Road bridge over the East Branch of the Fond du Lac River and the construction of the Wild Goose Prairie Trail within the project limits.

September 5 to September 9: Bridge crew will work on forming up & tying rebar, pouring concrete, curing the concrete and removing forms from the new west abutment on the northern section. Bridge crew will continue and finish removal of the old east abutment and begin grading and placing riprap. Pile driving will begin on the east abutment.

September 12 to September 16: Bridge crew will continue and finish pile driving for the east abutment. Crew will begin to form up and tie rebar and pour the southern section of the west abutment.

Traffic impacts: CTH W (Pioneer Road) will be closed to through traffic for the duration of the project. Local traffic will have access during the project except when construction is taking place in immediately in the vicinity of their residence or business. The contractor will coordinate with residents and businesses prior to any closures.

Detour Route: Fond du Lac County will post and maintain a detour during the duration of the project. The eastbound detour route is CTH W (Pioneer Road) to Hickory Street to USH 151 to Main Street and back to CTH W (Pioneer Road). The westbound detour route will be the reverse of the eastbound detour route.

Due to the overwhelming participation of county residents in the May Clean Sweep electronics collection, Fond du Lac County UW-Extension has planned a second event to take place on Saturday, September 24, 2011 from 9am until 3pm at the Fond du Lac County Fairgrounds Expo Building. All Fond du Lac County residents, farmers, school districts, and businesses are invited to participate, including all residents of the City of Waupun. There will be a one-time \$5 per vehicle (cash only) charge for all participants, regardless of the type or quantity of materials brought. 5R Processors, Ltd. of Ladysmith, WI will be collecting electronics for recycling at this event. Businesses are asked to contact 5R Processors directly at 715/532-2050 to receive a cost estimate. K-12 school districts with electronics are required to pre-register by calling the Fond du Lac County UW-Extension office at 920/929-3173. All other participants can bring electronics without pre-registering. For a fee of \$10 (cash only), 5R Processors will do a Department of Defense-approved hard drive wipe and send a certificate of data destruction to you after it is completed. To expedite this process, please come with your name and address written legibly on an index card. This event will be a collection of electronics of all kinds. Additionally, 5R will accept microwaves, vacuum cleaners, ovens, dishwashers, washing machines, and dryers at this event. No hazardous chemicals, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, freezers, refrigerators, explosives, batteries, or light bulbs will be accepted. Volunteers will be needed throughout the day to lift and unload heavy electronics from vehicles, stack and wrap pallets, and survey participants. Volunteers will receive refreshments and may bring their own electronics for recycling at no cost. It began in 2008 at Western Nevada College where professors Don Carlson and Marilee Swirczek worked with students to create an exhibit that began as a consideration of the effects of the Iraq and Afghanistan wars and evolved into a powerful meditation on the effects of war on the individual. The name for the exhibit was suggested by retired Marine Corps Major and English instructor at Western Nevada College Kevin Burns from an observation by writer Gertrude Stein: "War is never fatal, but always lost. Always lost." Central to the traveling exhibit is a collage of photos and the names of United States military war casualties in Iraq and Afghanistan since Sept. 11, 2001. Also included are the 2004 Pulitzer Prize-winning Iraq war combat photos of David Leeson and Cheryl Meyer courtesy of "The Dallas Morning News" and literary work of Swirczek's creative writing classes, veterans and their families. Locally, the exhibit has been expanded to include a "Never Forgotten" memorial to those soldiers from the Fond du Lac area who died serving our country from the Civil War period to the present day. UW-Fond du Lac Dean and CEO John N. Short noted that the Fond du Lac aspects of the exhibit have been designed, in part, to engage the Fond du Lac community in both a remembrance and celebration of the sacrifice, dedication and contributions that local veterans and their families demonstrate in our community every day. "Hosting the exhibit 'Always Lost' will permit us to honor those who sacrificed their lives in Afghanistan and Iraq and also to celebrate the accomplishments of living veterans from Afghanistan, Iraq and all of our other armed conflicts," said Short. UW-Fond du Lac Art Professor John Scotello is curating the exhibit and working with UW-Fond du Lac student veterans and art students, local veteran organizations and the Fond du Lac Historical Society to localize the exhibit. "Always Lost" is funded, in part, by the Nevada Arts Council and the National Endowment for the Arts. It is being brought to UW-Fond du Lac by the Student Life and Interest Committee (SLIC) and the Engaging Students in the First Year (ESFY) committee. This exhibit is the beginning of a year-long theme "War at the Personal Level" at UW-Fond du Lac. A few of the events planned for the upcoming academic year include the theater department's presentation of the play "My Soldiers" by Richard Kalinoski Nov. 2-6, a panel discussion on the "Always Lost" exhibit at noon on Oct. 20 and the common read of the book "The Things They Carried" by Tim O'Brien.
